

RESOLUTION No. 1053

A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Blue Lake Implementing the State's Updated Emergency Water Conservation Regulations

WHEREAS, California is experiencing one of the most severe droughts on record; and,

WHEREAS, Governor Brown declared a drought state of emergency on January 17, 2014, and called on all Californians to do their part to reduce their water use; and,

WHEREAS, Governor Brown signed an Executive Order on April 25, 2014 calling on the State to redouble state drought actions; and,

WHEREAS, last year, extreme drought covered nearly 80% of the state, and includes part of the Mad River Watershed, and these conditions will likely continue into the foreseeable future; and,

WHEREAS, the Humboldt Bay Municipal Water District has ample supply and is not experiencing a water shortage but recognizes that water supplies elsewhere are low; and,

WHEREAS, on May 5, 2015, the State Water Resources Control Board adopted final emergency water conservation regulations; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to comply with state regulations; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Blue Lake as follows:

- The use of outdoor irrigation with potable water of turf or ornamental landscapes is limited to no more than two days per week;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall remain in effect until February 20, 2016.


